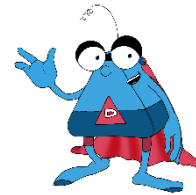

Involving patients from the start of a project is crucial for its success. Progress isn't possible without patient input on which challenges to address and how to conduct research in a way that doesn't burden participants further.



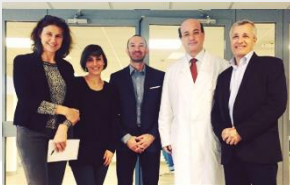
Patient Advisory Committee

Visit clinical sites

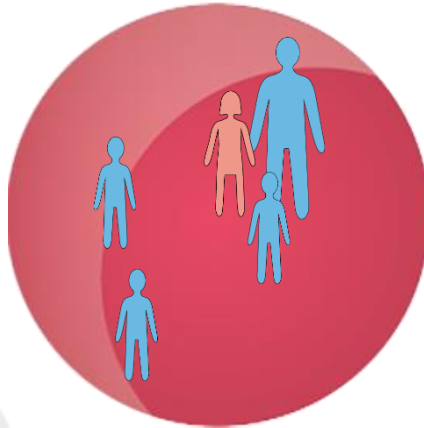
"Thanks to the PAC, I now much better understand the lives of people with type 1 diabetes, and can do a better job when I meet them in the clinic."

Recognising patients as experts of their disease and full stakeholders, at all stages, ensures better research.



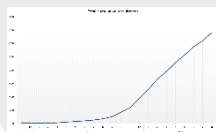
Booklets for children
