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Objectives of the consultation workshop on digital health

The goal of the workshop was to **gather ideas** from our stakeholders to **feed into the IMI topic development process**, and identify where an IMI project could bring most **value** in digital health.

Highlights of the discussion

Potential

- There is optimism, but this must be tempered by understanding what barriers for innovation to reach the patients
- Clearly, the technology is moving much faster than healthcare systems can react to deliver these innovations
- Which patients use technology, and patients as consumers.

Technology

- Alignment of value chains
- SMEs very active in the field, but find it difficult to enter IMI,
- Collaborate with other fields: eg ECSEL

Data

- Real-world data is messy, how to ensure quality etc...
- How can we be sure we can trust the data
- 'Citizen science' – provide access to data

Deliverables

- 'Medical Roadmap'
- IMI as validation platform
- Find new ways to involve innovative SMEs
 - SME market place, accelerator model
- Usability: Ensure solutions are developed with end users.
- Facilitate regulatory, HTA, payer discussions
- Collaborate with other areas, eg ECSEL
- Data: Findable, Accessible, Interoperable, Reusable (FAIR)
- Real world data harmonised accross multiple geographies
- Incentives for data sharing
- Skilled work force
